The Challenge: Limited Funding

20 Years of Foundation Funding

Recession: Environmental Foundations Shift

- Quantified Environmental Improvements
- Less Support for Education Programs



The Challenge: Limited Funding

Dwindling Foundation Funding (Last 5 Years)

- 2010: Hewlett \$125K
- 2011: Hewlett \$125K
- 2012: Bechtel \$100 K
- 2013: Bechtel \$99K (\$17.5K CA Publication)
- 2014: Bechtel \$89.5K

2012 State Justice Institute - \$27K (fracking)

2013 Board of Advisors Contributions — \$33.5K











Ethical Limitations on Fundraising

Judicial Independence

Lawyers Can't Give; Judges Can't Accept

No Connection To Fundraising

Judges Can't Ask for Themselves

Response: The NJC Water Justice Fund

Keep Judges Away from Fundraising
