

## Implementing the Vision

- Water Resources Sub-Cabinet Formed
  - Agriculture
  - Health and Environment
  - Wildlife, Parks & Tourism
  - Water Office





## 2015 Legislative Success

#### Water Conservation Areas (WCA)

- simple, streamlined and flexible tool
- any water right owner or group of owners develop a management plan
- water right flexibilities available
- original water tenants remain intact

#### Multi-Year Flex Account Balance Carry Forward

- Allows unused balance of a 5 year MYFA to carry forward to a new MYFA
- Encourage conservation and eliminate another use-it-or-lose-it scenario

#### Rewarding Conservation

Future regulation and management plans must recognize and consider previous conservation efforts

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Conservation Easements

- New tool allowing Division of Conservation to hold conservation easements
- To aid the project applicants in coping with the mitigation requirements resulting from 404 permit provisions






## Proposed Rule and Reg Changes

- Limiting point of diversion movement
  - ▶ 300 'in declining groundwater areas
  - Reduce GW declines & decrease impairment likelihood
- Stiffer Civil Penalties for Exceeding Authorized Quantity
- Civil Fines for Lack of Water Use Report
- Authority to Seal Meters
  - Discourage tampering

#### Water Transfers Act to be applied

- Public interest determination
- Trigger: Proposed transfers greater than 35 miles & greater than 2,500 acre-feet
- City of Hays and Russell municipal supply project
- Source: R9 Ranch water rights in Edwards County
- 80 + mile transfer to be proposed
