Background

 Reclamation States Emergency Drought Relief Act of 1991

 Initial drought program used primarily for emergency response actions

 In FY 2015, \$5.6 million was allocated to the Drought Response Program

Background – New Drought Program

 The New Drought Response Program enhances Reclamation's ability to assist in preparing for and addressing drought in advance of a crisis.

- The new program consists of three elements:
 - Drought Contingency Planning
 - Drought Resiliency Projects
 - Emergency Response Actions

Overall Funding & Process

Funding

- Allocated through a competitive process
- Minimum 50% non-federal cost-share
- Federal share up to stated maximum

Process

- Post Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) on www.grants.gov
- Evaluate eligible applications
- Notify applicants
- Execute financial assistance agreements

Drought Response Program

In Fiscal Year 2015, Reclamation provided financial assistance to:

- Develop/Update <u>Drought Contingency Plans</u>
 - Up to \$200K per Plan
- Implement <u>Drought Resiliency Projects</u>
 - Up to \$300K per Project

Drought Response Program Eligible Applicants

Eligible Applicants for Drought Response Program funding include the following located within the 17 Western States:

- States
- Indian Tribes
- Irrigation Districts
- Water Districts
- Other organizations with water and power delivery authority

Drought Contingency Planning

Funding is competitively awarded to assist development/updating Drought Plans addressing:

- 1. Drought Monitoring
- 2. Vulnerability Assessment (including Climate Change)
- 3. Mitigation Actions
- 4. Response Actions
- 5. Operational and Administrative Framework
- 6. Plan Update Process

Note: The applicable FOA provides details associated with addressing these 6 steps.

Drought Resiliency Projects

Funding is competitively awarded to assist projects that build resiliency to drought by:

- Increasing the amount/reliability of water supplies
- Improving water management
- Facilitating the sale, transfer, or exchange of water
- Providing benefits for fish and wildlife and the environment

Water conservation activities are eligibility for funding under the WaterSMART Grants and Water Conservation Field Services Programs.
